



THE ASSESSMENT OF AWARDS PROJECT PERSONALITY INVENTORY FOR ADULTS WITH DOWN SYNDROME

The inventory is approached with the "obligatory selection method", which involves selecting one of two yes/no answers. In the scoring of the inventory, one point should be awarded for each correct answer in the subscales.

The decrease in the scores obtained from the inventory means that the compliance scores decrease. Therefore, scores corresponding to 25% indicate the upper limit of the "critical zone" for the "discordance". The points in this column and those with lower scores remind us of the possibility that there may be some adaptation problems in terms of the qualities indicated by that subscale.

Before scoring the inventory, (E) and (V) scores must be obtained. The (E) score is a validity score that roughly expresses whether the individual expresses himself/herself with reference to his/her experience while answering the inventory, or whether he/she has a defensive attitude. It is obtained by adding the number of items left blank. An increase in the (E) score is interpreted as negative. If the (E) score on the answer sheet is 2 on a subscale and 8 or more in total, the answer sheet should be considered invalid and should not be included in the scoring.







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The (V) score is obtained if the individual answers the inventory with careful and conscious insight. It is a validity score related to the behaviour of the person filling out the inventory, as well as whether the answer sheet is filled out without careful reading and examining each item. The maximum value that the validity score can reach is 8. In practice, if the (V) score is 5 or lower, the answer sheet is considered invalid and not included in the scoring.

There are items that must be marked the same in order to obtain the (V) score. These; (21-167), (42-143), (63-120), (84-95), (105-71), (126-48), (147-25), (168-1). If these items are marked in the same way on the answer sheet, points should be given, if different, no points should be given.
